Health and social care are working together - to support individuals' rehabilitation in a familiar environment in their own homes

Duplication of work -

Improvements are being undertaken to address this as there should be a single health record for patients

Patients should be able to access services directly for repeat appointments - the health board is taking part in the 'silly rules' project to highlight problems that get in the way of better care and support

Where can people go for information and help when community centres are being closed? - There is funding for charities and plans for health and social care hubs

How can we ensure people with learning difficulties don't become isolated due to cutbacks? Learning disability transformation programme aims to provide greater equity and improved opportunities

6

Concerns about the decision to close care homes - questions were asked by families and residents - RCT are working with partners in health to ensure care is available
